

12,000 Masks in Brazil

The District Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of Brazil, concerned with the impact COVID19 caused among the most vulnerable parts of the population, have engaged in several fundraising activities and other actionable campaigns to support these vulnerable groups.

A Worshipful Brother of the District who owns a textile company, produced masks for District grand Lodge at cost price to be distributed.

The District Grand Charity Steward contacted all the Masters and Commanders of Lodges within the district to inform about the campaign and received a very positive and admirable response.

The initial goal was to purchase and distribute 10,000 masks. In just over 30 days, more than 12,000 masks had already been manufactured and distributed to the poorest regions of São Paulo and Rio de Janeiro.

ISightCornwall, who are based at Newham Industrial Park in Truro, recently received the remarkable sum of £10,700 thanks to the Mark Benevolent Fund. The presentation was made in person by Cornwall Mark Provincial Grand Master, Right Worshipful Brother Kevin John Hicks.

Due to the Coronavirus, numbers were restricted to a minimum which included the Provincial Grand Master, myself and local Truro/Falmouth MP Mrs Cherilyn Mackrory. The presentation was made direct to ISightCornwall Chief Executive, Ms Carole Theobald, in the newly renovated entrance lobby, which funded the renovations.

Carole commented; "Thanks to the extreme generosity of the Mark Benevolent Fund and the Cornish Mark Freemasons in particular, we have received a vital cash boost to enable us to make essential access alterations to our entrance lobby, which we are completely thrilled with. We are delighted to receive such wonderful support from the MBF & the Brethren of Cornwall Mark Masons. I genuinely cannot thank their Provincial Grand Master, Kevin Hicks enough for his support and his valuable time in making this presentation, especially during these difficult Covid times. Thankfully, with the new layout we have the space to be socially distant which would not have been possible before."

The Provincial Grand Master added; "I am absolutely thrilled to have been invited to present such a magnificent sum of money on behalf of the Mark Benevolent Fund and the Cornish Mark Brethren, to such a highly respected and local deserving charity, based here in Truro. Having recently been appointed as a trustee of the MBF I know only too well the importance these vital funds make towards local charities, particularly in working to support our local communities across Cornwall. Also being the oldest charity here in Cornwall clearly shows how vital and highly regarded ISightCornwallis, by the Cornish public"

Mrs Cherilyn Mackory, the local MP for Truro & Falmouth was delighted to be invited to the presentation and discussed the sterling work carried out by ISightCornwall in support of the Cornish residents. Clearly the extremely generous donation, made by the Mark Benevolent Fund, has afforded the essential renovations for the new entrance lobby. It will make a tremendous difference for those dealing with sight loss or visual impairment.

A fabulous new minibus presented to Age UK Manchester by the Mark Benevolent Fund



On 3 November, the Mark Provincial Grand Master for East Lancashire, R.W.Bro. Alexander Sillars McLaren, accompanied by the Provincial Grand Almoner, W.Bro. Barry Heal and W.Bro. Bob Summers attended the premises of Age UK Manchester at Openshaw, on the east side of Manchester.

The purpose of the visit was to officially present the Minibus that was generously funded by the Mark Benevolent Fund to the value of £32,739 (excluding VAT).

It is a wonderful vehicle fully equipped with wheelchair access and the appropriate signage of the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons and the Mark Benevolent Fund.

We were met by Mrs Shirley Charlton who offered us shelter from the inclement weather and, wearing our masks and socially distanced, we enjoyed a cup of tea.

The Provincial Grand Master briefly outlined the background of the Mark Benevolent Fund and some of the recent grants that have been made to the St John Ambulance, the Blood bikes etc but also mentioning a few of the smaller grants which are just as important.

We then went outside and WBro Summers took several photographs of the vehicle, Mrs Charlton, the Provincial Grand Master and the Provincial Almoner.

It has to be said that Mrs Charlton and all the staff that were present were absolutely delighted with their new Minibus and were keen to let us know how much of a difference it will make to the services they provide.

Their current vehicle, an 05 plate, was parked up near the new vehicle and one of the drivers informed us how unreliable that vehicle had become. Hopefully they will not have that problem with their new vehicle.

Shirley Charlton said:

"There are two very old minibuses here at Openshaw and, during the last few months, one of them has had to be put out of use. It finally got to the point that we could not afford to repair it."

Sally Dervan, Chief Executive of Age UK Manchester said:

"We are delighted by the amazing news that The Mark Benevolent Fund have extended their generosity by funding a new minibus for our Openshaw Day Care Centre. We can assure you that the vehicle will make an enormous difference to the lives of vulnerable older people in Manchester. This is enormously valuable to us at a time when our work with vulnerable people is more important than ever before."

Age UK Manchester (previously known as Age Concern Manchester) is a charity serving North Manchester communities such as Abbey Hey, Gorton, Openshaw, Clayton, Moston, Middleton and Blakeley. The Centre provides both Day Care and Home Care for these communities and is a very important service which provides assistance for people with Dementia, Alzheimer's, physical disabilities and mental disabilities.

The R.III. Intendant-General, Steve Roberts and III.Kt. Ray Wade, Divisional Recorder, were very pleased to visit St Andrew's Children's Hospice "Andy's" in Grimsby on 20 October to present a cheque for £2,500 on behalf of the Grand Sovereign's Care for Children's Fund.

Andy's offers free palliative care to children and young people from birth to the age of 25 years with any progressive life-limiting illness; the care is available in a wide range of settings which includes 24-hour care as well as day care and bereavement support.

Receiving the cheque, Fundraising and Events Coordinator John Stobart expressed the Hospices deep gratitude and reminded us that their services were only made possible by the generosity and

assistance of corporate organisations, local businesses and individuals, as statutory sources only partially cover their running costs (around 19%).



The Gift of Sight Fair continues...




