Spotlight on the Order of Malta



Tuesday, 17 November, should have been the annual meeting of the Chapter of Great Priory of Malta.

To those who aren't members of the Order of Knights Templar it might not be instantly obvious what this means. The full title of our Knightly Orders is The United Religious, Military and Masonic Orders of the Temple and of St John of Jerusalem, Palestine, Rhodes and Malta in England and Wales and Provinces Overseas. As the name suggests, there is a union here of two Orders, that of the Temple and that of St John. The Order of Knights Templar focuses on a ceremony based around the journey undertaken by a Pilgrim on his way to becoming Knight. Once this has been completed the Knight may then progress through the ceremony of a Knight of Malta, which elaborates upon the passage taken by the historic Knights of St John, or Knights Hospitaller as they are often referred to, through the regions of Jerusalem, Palestine, Rhodes and Malta (and also Cyprus and Candia, now Crete).

Masonically, the relationship between these two Orders is similar to that of the Mark and Royal Ark Mariner, or the Craft and Royal Arch. There is a separate structure, unique regalia, different Officers' titles, but - differently - meetings of Priories of Malta are held under the Warrant of the Preceptory of Knights Templar, and so no additional membership is required.

Not every Preceptory of Knights Templar performs the Malta ceremony. It is often conferred by those Preceptories which have the necessary equipment to do so; plus at meetings presided over by the Province and, unusually, the ceremony is also conferred, in full, at the annual meeting of Great Priory by the active Great Officers of the Year. Quite a spectacle which, of course, this year we have been deprived of.

If you have wondered about the special bond that exists between the United Orders and their chosen charity, the St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital, the answer lies here in the link with the historic Knights of St John, and the Most Eminent and Supreme Grand Master, Paul Raymond Clement, Knight Grand Cross of the United Orders, gives further detail about this link in his address to mark Tuesday's scheduled meeting in the video below.

In addition, the Great Prelate, R.E.Kt. Reverend Fr Malcolm C G Lane, JP, K.C.M., was pleased to send the following message to all Knights of the Order:




The Swift pins are now being posted out but please bear with us as we are only in the office one day per week to carry out this task so some deliveries will take longer than others. Thank you for your patience.

"It doesn't get better than the magic of the Mark"



W.Bro. Peter Wreford, P.G.St.B., R.A.M.G.R., born 14 November 1931 was celebrating his 89th birthday at his home in Bognor Regis, West Sussex, on Saturday last when, to his surprise he answered a knock at the door to find Prov.G.M. Roger Richardson there to greet him in person, not only for his birthday but to make two other presentations.

The first was a Grand Certificate to commemorate his achievement of over 50 years continuous service in the Mark Degree and the second, was a certificate from the Mark Province of Sussex, marking his achievement of 50 years plus in the Mark and over 40 years in the Ancient and Honourable Fraternity of Royal Ark Mariner.

W.Bro. Peter was Advanced into Hothampton Mark Lodge No. 703 on 19 November 1969 and Elevated into the Royal Ark Mariner, moored to that Lodge in March 1980. He has given sterling service to both Lodges, now as the Lodge Almoner and for many years as the Director of Ceremonies, keeping a close eye on protocols and the standards of ritual. As a businessman, Peter was well known in and around Bognor as a Master Builder, specialising in property renovation and extension.





Introducing "Preludes"



As well as receiving an MBF Grant of £4,500 which "will enable the charity to develop this vital support media for children in deprived areas of the City who have suffered a lack of educational input during the Coronavirus pandemic" our friends at Preludes have also been fortunate that Penny Rawlings, Manager of Preludes, The Bristol Ensemble, has been chosen by The National Lottery Promotions Unit as one of 13 individuals from around the British Isles to be rewarded for their contribution to the ARTS throughout the difficult times of the Coronavirus pandemic.

Preludes, the education arm of the Bristol Ensemble, works in areas of Bristol that are experiencing high levels of economic disadvantage and aims to put music at the heart of every child's education.

Manager, Penny Rawlings, is one of a group of dedicated music professionals, who bring enjoyment, confidence, coordination, speech and language skills into children's education.

"Some of the children have special needs and can easily feel like failures because they can't do as much academic work. They can do the music, it's a special place where they can be equal. Music is a great leveller; we make sure that everyone can achieve in music and not just those who are perhaps more academic. The teachers love our music lessons because we are able to level groups up and make sure that those children who are not succeeding in other areas can succeed in music."

Forced to curtail their activities due to lockdown, the group made an incredible number of videos to send to schools using the music teachers who usually taught them. The videos were also put on school online platforms for children at home to access where they had internet. In some schools they were also able to continue teaching some vulnerable children — and in addition there were 45 online recitals with freelance Bristol Ensemble players. Preludes was very fortunate to receive funding from the **Mark Benevolent Fund** to support the creation of these videos during lockdown.

"There can be a lot of vulnerable children in our groups, so if they're not going to school, they might not eat that day or access education. For us, it was trying to keep some of those more vulnerable kids going and giving them something to look forward to," she says.

"We put in a lot of sessions of music for these children, largely in Knowle West and Lawrence Weston, but we had kids coming from other schools coming in as well. We were providing quite a service."

After creating two amazing videos dedicated to the Covid-19 pandemic, one of which is a comic take on the Lockdown experience and the other the Barber Adagio, Penny says the group's latest plan is to reproduce The Lark Ascending, a work by Vaughan Williams from exactly 100 years ago. The first performance was held in Shirehampton Village Hall, Bristol in 1920 and it's a wonderful piece of music to introduce to children.

Antient Drama, Modern Production



The Operatives Annual Grand Assembly, is held on the 4th Tuesday of September each year. Part of the activities on that special day is the performance of the Antient Drama, when the retiring 3rd Grand Master Mason loses everything, and his replacement gains his chain of Office. This year we also Installed a new 1st Grand Master Mason.

COVID-19 meant we would have to perform this without the usual audience, which was going to be less than satisfactory. It was decided that the whole ceremony would be filmed by a professional media company, for which we owe a massive debt of thanks to Mark Masons' Hall for providing the location and significant support. This task has now been completed and the 1 hour video is available via a screening service for anyone to witness, members and non-members alike.
