#### The Last Mile

Over the past few months W.Bro. Simon McCarthy of Welcome Mark Lodge No. 1237 in the Province of Surrey has been out on his bike on the roads of Surrey and Hampshire in all weathers in support of the Surrey Mark 2022 Festival. His target was 2022 miles by the end of October 2020.

We have been following Simon's bike ride via his Strava app. and on Saturday in the pouring rain Simon had reached a total of 2021 miles leaving one mile to complete his goal. Our Provincial Grand Master, R.W.Bro. Ian N. Clark, was there at the finish line at Box Hill to congratulate Simon and celebrate with him his magnificent effort on behalf of our Festival.



We are pleased to announce that Simon has exceeded his target of raising £2,500 for our 2022 MBF Festival – a fantastic personal achievement; especially considering that Simon's heart only works at 65% capacity due to a heart attack two years ago, and he lost part of a lung due to cancer.

Also present at the finish were representatives of some of the Surrey Orders who have been supporting Simon both financially, and with a lot of encouragement.

### More news of the good work the MBF has supported



Just 12 months ago the Mark Benevolent Fund awarded a Major Grant to 'Safe Anchor Trust', a Mirfield Charity which provides free Canal Boat trips for disabled and disadvantaged people, mainly children and young adults. The grant was for the refurbishment of one of its Canal Boats, 'Safe Anchor Lady'.

The refurbishment was completed in March, just as the country went into national lockdown, but we have just received the following update from Safe Anchor, showing that all has not been lost this year. Such initiatives and creative thinking has been widespread throughout or own and many other organisations this year. True examples for us all:

"The COVID 19 pandemic has had a huge impact on the operations of Safe Anchor Trust, with none of our 'traditional trips' running this year.

Almost without exception our passenger groups are in the 'vulnerable category' and it was very clear from the start that none of them would be venturing out, even when the regulations and guidelines were relaxed in July.

We were very conscious that our boats, including the newly refurbished 'Safe Anchor Lady' were idle, but with social distancing being almost impossible on a boat things were very difficult for us.

Challenging times needed a creative solution and we introduced 'Bubble Boat Trips' (BBTs). These are short trips, around 50 minutes, specifically for individual households and their support bubble, so social distancing amongst them is not required. The two crew members remain at the rear of the boat, socially distanced from each other, the passengers in the main cabin or on the front deck.

We have run BBTs every other weekend since the beginning of August, with 10-11 boat trips per day, and they have been hugely popular with every trip booked within minutes of becoming available.

#### Virtual Talk to Northumberland Freemasons.

Whilst the majority of Northumbria Blood Bikes talk requests have been put on hold or declined due to Covid-19 restrictions our talks Coordinator Nigel Barlow, knowing volunteer rider and speaker John Watts is a keen user of "Facebook live" passed a request from the Northumberland Provincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons his way.

This organisation are regularly keeping in touch with members unable to meet physically using Zoom video conferencing technology and to interest and engage attendees have a guest speaker each Monday.

On Monday, 2 November, John, assisted by our new member Peter Boyle as socially distanced camera operator, delivered such a talk. Using Blood Bike "Mark Master Mason" as a prop John thanked the virtual audience for the £18,000 grant from their national charity which paid for this Pan European motorcycle in 2016 and told them about some of the bikes missions during the 74,500 miles travelled on its 4 years of blood bike duty.

## John was wearing one of our new Motorola radios, also funded by the Freemasons' Mark Benevolent Fund with a £24,000 grant earlier in 2020.

Whilst the purpose of this talk was awareness raising and a thank-you, NBB were delighted to subsequently receive a further donation from local masonic funds of £250 which had been unanimously agreed by members after John had concluded the talk and left the Zoom meeting.

Richard Northey, Deputy Provincial Grand Master wrote, "Many thanks for joining us today and giving that superb presentation on the Northumbria Blood Bikes. It was much appreciated as was shown by the attendance and the extended Q&A session afterwards. I hope we didn't go on too long for you but there was a lot of interest in the Blood Bike work and many positive comments after you left the meeting to return the bike.

All I can say after all we heard this afternoon is keep up the fantastic work and well done."

Nigel Barlow, NBB talks coordinator who attended the talk and took photographs said, "It's been frustrating that our physical talks have been suspended to prevent the spread of Covid, but this is an excellent example of how we can still deliver Blood Bike presentations in a safe manner and if any other organisations would like a virtual talk I'll try to match a presenter with the request".

On 11 November, London Mark will be holding a short Zoom session to remember the Fallen.



## The Gift of Sight Fair continues...


