£4,000 Grant awarded by the M.B.F. to Fund Leicestershire & Rutland's Mark Keystone Festive Hampers



With the success of the Keystone Box Scheme run earlier this year by the Mark Masons of Leicestershire and Rutland thanks to a generous funding grant from the M.B.F., at its conclusion it was hoped that the worst of the lockdown and the impacts of the pandemic had passed. Sadly, the impacts of the pandemic are well entrenched and for what could well turn out to be until well into the new year, and the situation for so many this Christmas is shaping up to be pretty bleak.

To make a difference in the lives of our most vulnerable Mark Masons and our widows spread across the Province, having put together a proposal for funding support, Provincial Grand Master, R. W. Bro. Phillip Mann is delighted that the Mark Benevolent Fund's Worthy Causes Committee awarded our Province a grant of £4,000 to fund a one-off distribution on Sunday 20th December of Keystone Festive Hampers filled with a range of seasonal goodies.

Grateful thanks go to the Charities Manager at Mark Masons' Hall, W. Bro. Darren Coleman-Heald and the Committee for their prompt response and award, and as earlier in the year, the Provincial

Grand Charity Steward W. Bro. Clive Weston and Provincial Grand Secretary W. Bro. Peter Gibson-Leitch who together set up and managed the original scheme are bringing their expertise to bear to do the same again, and have been able to call on the kindness and the 'Spirit of the Mark' to raise a team of well over fifty volunteers and delivery drivers drawn from our membership to pack and sort the hampers and deliver them to the doorsteps in time for Christmas.

Helping out in Hong Kong



On Friday, 18 December, R.W.Bro. Patrick Purnell-Edwards, District Grand Master for Hong Kong, visited the Duchess of Kent Children's Hospital to present a cheque from the District for the purchase of an Otoacoustic Emission System (to be used in the audiology department), and also to deliver soft toys donated by members of P C Woo Lodge No. 721 at their recent installation. Because of Covid-19 the traditional visit by the Royal Ark Mariner brethren to present the toys to the patients in the wards was not possible. Indeed, the toys will be quarantined for 7 days, so will barely reach the children in time for Christmas Day.

The Assistant Grand Master, R.W.Bro. Steve Davison, visited the same hospital in June 2019, and afterwards very generously proposed a donation by the Mark Benevolent Fund for the purchase of a Metatherapy Treatment System, which is now in use.






