Great excitement as the new SERV Herts and Beds Emergency Blood Car, donated by the members of the Mark Province of Hertfordshire, arrives for the official handover.

The setting was Harpenden Fire Station, one of the bases for the new car and the existing Blood Bikes. All four SERV Herts and Beds Blood Bikes were also at the ceremony, the first time that they have all been in the same place at the same time in their history, along with their riders: Dave Wilson, Ian Beswetherick, Steve Groves and John McCombe, all highly experienced and exceptionally hard-working volunteers who each complete over 100 life-saving runs every year.

However, today, on behalf of all the members of the Hertfordshire Mark, I am delighted to formally hand over the keys for this superb vehicle which is such a significant addition to the SERV Herts and Beds fleet. I am so proud that the generosity of our Hertfordshire Mark Brethren has enabled us to continue to support SERV and the Human Milk Foundation in their ongoing life-saving work in such a significant manner."

Ian Hunt, Chairman of the SERV Herts and Beds Group confirmed that this important new addition to the fleet has already enabled their volunteers to expand their vital service by providing a significant increase in capacity and flexibility. A prime example being urgent consignments of neo-natal donor milk, which would usually require numerous Blood Bikes and riders to fulfil but can be accomplished by a single car journey. The car's ability to operate at temperatures too low for bikes to carry blood, and the benefit of a liveried car in negotiating London traffic, were also cited by Mr Hunt. 

Staying with Hertfordshire, V.W.Bro. Norwell Roberts, *QPM*, P.G.J.O., and Provincial Grand Almoner for the Mark in Herts, has made the cover of the latest edition of Freemasonry today.

Inside you can read a fascinating interview with him, highlighting his career in the Metropolitan Police, where he hit the beat as London's first black police constable in 1967 and culminating in being awarded the Queen's Police Medal (presented by Prince Charles) in 1996.

His love of Freemasonry and his devotion to the role of Almoner, both in Craft and Mark, also shines through.

Norwell, who is also the current Grand Sword Bearer in the Royal and Select Masters, is a regular contributor to the police and other organisations looking for commentary around Black History Month Click Here⁶ and last year, as well as the Met Police and London transport, he gave a Zoom talk to a school in Bromley Kent and another to a large group of Met Police Solicitors.

Norwell also told us of occasions when he performed as Father Christmas at a Day Nursery for 50 Disadvantaged Children aged 0-5 years old for 35 years.

"I raised money to enable them to go to Lapland. I also hired a bus so that they could meet Santa at Blackbushe Airport when he arrived from the North Pole on an Aircraft flown by the Pop Star Gary Numan. That was the best of my surprises for the kids.

Additionally, I played Santa at many places/schools and Police functions. I really enjoyed being Santa as I really made the children happy.

On one occasion when the Children were taken to see another Father Christmas at Harrods one 3 year old remarked to him that he was not a real Father Christmas. The staff were taken aback when he asked "Why not"...fearing that the child would say "Because you are not black" However the reply was "Because you do not come to our nursery".....The moral of the story is for children colour was not an issue."



Here, Paul tells us of his recent expedition to raise funds for a friend in need:


"Around December 2019 our dear friend, Paulie Barter was sadly diagnosed with Acute disseminated encephalomyelitis (ADEM), a very rare brain condition. This was extremely sudden and has been such a strain on his wonderful family. After the Covid outbreak Paulie was unable to get the treatment required for his long road to recovery, so his family have taken it upon themselves to try and raise funds to help him get back to where he was.

What with Paulie being the provider for his family, this has hit home like a ton of bricks but with the help of his wife, his family and some very close friends we decided that we were going to do as many charity events as possible until we get the funds needed to get him back into rehabilitation.

This was kick-started by our good friend Terry Knotts who raised a few thousand pounds on a charity bike ride from London to Brighton. He did brilliantly and really helped get the fund off to a great start.

With charity being at the heart of Freemasonry it was clear to me that I also had to get involved and, with a few good friends, brothers Anthony and Steven Condon, Anthony Evans and Keith Ng we decided that our event will be a hike through the Peak District.

12 miles roughly from point to point each with a 50kg rucksack, fully loaded with our tents sleeping bags, stoves and food, I can honestly say this was one of the hardest things I've ever had to do and I'm sure the boys would agree."



"We had fun in caves on our travels, met plenty of friendly locals and may have even stopped off for the odd pint or two.

This is the first of a few events that will be done for Paulie, a parachute jump is also planned later in the year.

Our goal is to not just raise money but to also raise awareness for this terrible illness and hopefully we will do exactly that.

The volunteer contacted the Aurelius Lodge Almoner in the form of W.Bro. L. Thurston who then proposed the idea to the Essex Mark Benevolent Fund who subsequently granted the money in order to purchase the equipment.

Poole expressed his joy that the Lodge was finally able to meet, noting that Keystone David Panmure Lodge was the first Mark Lodge in the District to have a meeting since lockdown in South Africa commenced in March 2020. The Lodge is supporting the District's Annual Charity Fundraiser, the Mbabala Hunt, which has to date raised over R100 000 for the Old Age Home in Tarkastad. The 2021 charity event is a smaller one due to Covid-19 restrictions, but will nonetheless be a successful one.

Three other Mark Lodges are due to meet in the next 6 weeks, where Installations are planned.

Panmure Goodfellowship Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners No. 423 met on the same day and elected two joining members and 4 candidates for Elevation. Planning for these Elevations is underway, and bodes well for Royal Ark Masonry in the Eastern Part of the District.

All of this is extremely exciting for a small District that is well on the way to recovery after possibly one of the most bizarre times in living memory.
